### NUMBER

In English, a noun may either be singular or plural in number :

- \* When we speak about one person, one animal or one thing, we use the noun in the singular form. For example : boy, tiger, box, calf, story.
- \* When we speak about two or more persons, animals or things, we use the noun in the plural form. For example : boys, tigers, boxes, calves, stories.

### Forming Plural Nouns :

Singular nouns can be changed to plural in various ways.

- \* By adding -s at the final position of a noun. It is added to almost all common and collective nouns except some of them as discussed in the given rules.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
room + s =	rooms	teacher + s =	teachers
tree + s =	trees	student + s =	students

- \* By adding -es at the final position of a noun. It is added to the nouns ending in 'o' or 'hissing sound' such as ch, sh, s, ss, x.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
mango + es =	mangoes	bench + es =	benches
fox + es =	foxes	mosquito + es =	mosquitoes

- \* The following nouns ending in 'o' do not take -es but -s at its final position to make plural forms.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
photo + s =	photos	radio + s =	radios
piano + s =	pianos	studio + s =	studios

- \* By replacing y with -ies in the final position of a noun. This happens only when the final -y has a consonant letter before it. With the nouns having vowel letter before the final -y, only -s is added at the final position of a noun.

\* By replacing *f*/*fe* with *-es* in the final position of a noun.

wolf + es =	wolves	knife + es =	knives
live + es =	lives	wife + es =	wives

\* The following nouns are **exceptions** to this rule and, thus, form their plural simply by adding *-s* to their final position.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
roof + s =	roofs	chief + s =	chiefs
dwarf + s =	dwarfs	handkerchief + s =	handkerchiefs

\* By adding *-s* to the main/principal word in the compound nouns (nouns with more than one word).

Singular	Plural
passer-by + s =	passers-by (not passer-bys)
mother-in-law + s =	mothers-in-law (not mother-in laws)

\* By changing the vowels used in the middle position of a noun.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
woman	women	mouse	mice
man	men	foot	feet
tooth	teeth	statesman	statesmen

\* By adding *-en/-ren* in the final position of a noun.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
ox + en =	oxen	child + ren =	children

\* By adding *-s* (apostrophe) or simply *-s* at the end position of abbreviated nouns.

Singular	Plural	Singular	Plural
B.A. + s =	B.A.'s/BA's	1990 + s =	1990's/1990s
MLA + s =	MLA's/MLA's	M.P. + s =	M.P.'s/MP's
